

DAEiNA Meeting 2013 – Invitation and Call for Papers

The 2nd annual meeting of Danish Academic Economists in North America (DAEiNA) will be held on **April 20, 2013** at the **Kellogg School of Management**, **Northwestern University, Evanston, IL**.

The meeting will consist of paper presentations, a brief organizational meeting, networking opportunities over lunch/dinner/coffee, as well as a keynote speech by the honorary DAEiNA member and Nobel laureate **Dale T. Mortensen**.

To request a **presentation slot** please submit a paper or abstract to <u>daeina@daeina.net</u>. Presentation slots will allocated on a **rolling basis**, however, the final deadline for submission will be **March 15**, **2013**. We encourage the presentation of preliminary work, particularly from PhD students. In allocating slots, particular preference will also be given to PhD students who are about to go on the academic job market.

In addition to requests for presentation slots, we also ask all interested DAEiNA members to submit a non-binding **expression of interest** to <u>daeina@daeina.net</u> in order to facilitate coordination of rooms as well as catering.

DAEiNA is in the process of applying for funds to cover travel and hotel costs for a small number of people; however, participants are strongly encouraged to **seek funds on their own**. For students in particular, signing up to present at the meetings may be a good way of securing travel funding from the home institution.
